Work engagement, Burnout, Depression and Help-Seeking Among Medical Residents

Prior research has consistently found high rates of burnout, depression, and suicidal ideation among physicians and residents nation-wide. With an eye toward future interventions, the goal of this project is to assess predictors of work engagement, burnout, and depression, as well as predictors of help-seeking for depression. Data collection will involve a three-wave longitudinal survey will be administered to a random and representative sample of residents across the range of HCA hospitals and residency programs. The longitudinal nature of the study will allow a thorough assessment of potential protective factors such as meaning in work, supervisor autonomy support, and social support. Moreover, this design will allow an assessment as to how the onset of depression influences help-seeking outcome expectations, intentions, and behavior.

Fletcher Jones Foundation (via CGU, 2018-2019, approximately \$6,665.00 Principal Investigator):

Using an Attitude Strength Diagnostic to Increase Help-seeking Intentions Among People Experiencing Depression.

The goal of the current research is to assess a new approach for increasing help-seeking among people with depression. This approach is derived from recent research that examined the strength of help-seeking attitudes held by people with depression (see Siegel, Lienemann, & Tan, 2015 for initial contemplations about this idea). With an eye toward future intervention efforts, the current proposal seeks to take the first step toward assessing whether the attitude strength diagnostic has led us to a successful path for persuading people with depression. To take this first step, we will conduct a study that has the highest potential for making positive thoughts about help-seeking salient and more strongly held, thus increasing help-seeking intentions. If successful, the results will be part of a federal grant to allow the creation of video messages and a large-scale assessment of this approach.

Research indicates exponential rates of adoption of e-cigarettes among adolescents, coupled with preliminary but growing evidence of serious health threats from use. Available physiological evidence is sketchy, but almost invariably threatening. This application is designed to create the basis for a proposal to be submitted to NIDA that will reduce demand. We employ techniques that have proven their effectiveness in work on marijuana and inhalant prevention. These involve learning adolescents' knowledge, perceptions, and attitudes regarding e-cigarettes, and determining the relations among these cognitions, along with standard predictors of use, with intentions and actual use of these products.

Vested interest, pride, and the MVD: Increasing registration rates of adults 50+

The goal of this project is to assess a means of increasing organ donor registration rates among a pan-cultural sample (i.e., Spanish-Dominant Hispanics, non-Spanish Dominant Hispanics, non-Hispanics) of adults 50 years of age and older (50+). We will create and deploy bi-lingual videos, posters, and point-of-decision materials for two complementary studies taking place in multiple MVDs in New Mexico (Study 1 = 18 MVDs, Study 2 = 24 MVDs). Study 1 will explore the effectiveness of an appeal that focuses on the benefits experienced by the family of donors. Study 2 will attempt to amplify the effectiveness of the proposed approach by simultaneously inducing potential donors with feelings of family pride, or *naches*. The current project is a collaborative project between Claremont Graduate University (CGU), New Mexico Donor Services (NMDS), the New Mexico Motor Vehicles Department (MVD), and consultant Sara Pace Jones (Donor Network of Arizona).

Maximizing donor registrations among Hispanics: A positive psychology approach

Organ donor scholars have long attempted to close the divide between the number of people in need of an organ transplant and the number of organs available for transplantation. However, recent advances in positive psychology indicate that eliciting positive emotions may be a better way of motivating people to register as organ donors. This research project seeks to determine through a survey experiment whether positive emotions (e.g., elevation, gratitude) are better motivators of organ donor registration behavior than negative emotions (e.g., guilt, empathy toward someone in a dire situation).

NIDA (2013-2017, \$1,588,845, Co-Investigator):

Understanding and Overcoming Adolescents Resistance to Anti-Marijuana Ads

This project is based on the premise that persuading youth to adopt and maintain anti-marijuana attitudes may require messages tailored to their specific beliefs. Tailored messages are more effective than generic health messages, and can be easily delivered in today's classrooms through an interactive computer program. The proposed research seeks to deliver tailored persuasive messages to adolescents based on the use of two complementary models, the Resistance Appraisal Model and the Deviance Regulation Model. These models account for and capitalize on two critical variables: resistance to persuasion and social norms.

HRSA/DoT (2014-2017, approximately \$700,000, Co-Investigator):

Replication of a mail-based campaign to increase organ donation.

This project replicate and extends an original letter-based direct mail campaign implemented in Illinois in a series of three campaign waves. Across all three waves, the target population will be comprised of 16-18 year-old Arizona residents. Moreover, all letters will include information on the need for organ transplants and donors among minors. The original HRSA-Dot project being replicated in the current proposal involved a direct mail campaign in Illinois targeting 18 year-olds with a driver's license or state identification card. Given a historical difficulty in motivating individuals at this age to register as organ donors, the project aimed to improve registration rates via a direct mail campaign. The modifications are designed to build on the theoretical processes proposed to underlie the success of the original project so as to further enhance the impact of a direct mail campaign for youth in transition to adulthood.
